# Isaiah 7:1, 2 Shaken!

 War breaks out when King Rezin of Aram (Syria) and King Pekah of Israel (Ephraim) attack King Ahaz of Judah. Since Aram and Israel weren't able to overpower Jerusalem (7:1), you'd think the people would have been encouraged. Why were they shaking in fear (7:2)? (cf. 2 Chronicles 28:5-8)

Edom and Philistia also attacked Judah at this time. Why was King Ahaz of Judah having so many problems? (cf. 2 Chronicles 28:1-4, 19, 23-25)

#### Isaiah 7:10-15 A Sign

- 6. Explain: God's patience with King Ahaz was truly extra-ordinary, and so is his patience with us. (List at least three examples for each.)
- 7. God gave King Ahaz a sign whether he wanted one or not. "*The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel [God with us]*" (Isaiah 7:14).

How was this a sign of grace?

How was this a sign of judgment?

#### Isaiah 8:1-10 More than You Bargained for

- 8. Isaiah was supposed to name his next son "Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz" which means "quick to the plunder, swift to the spoil" (or perhaps we would simply call him: "Rapid Raider"). The boy was to be a walking advertisement of what Assyria would do to the northern kingdom of Israel and to Syria, enemies of King Ahaz and Judah. That was good! But what, according to Isaiah 8:6-8, wasn't so good?
- 9. In response to the news, Isaiah cries: "O Immanuel!" (Isaiah 8:8) How do verses 9 and 10 demonstrate that this was not the "Oh my God!" people spew forth today without much thought?
