Esteem: Image and the Xerox Machine

I. What does the Bible mean when it uses the word "image?"

The Bible tells us that we were created "in the image of God." (Gen 1:26-27) There are two Hebrew words used for "image" in that passage. What does the word "image" mean? Some of the passages below show us how those Hebrew words were used in other passages. This helps us determine what the words meant in regards to us at creation.

1Sam. 6:5 Make models of the tumors and of the rats that are destroying the country, ...

Ezek. 23:14 "But she carried her prostitution still further. She saw men portrayed on a wall, figures of Chaldeans portrayed in red,

2Kgs. 16:10 Then King Ahaz went to Damascus to meet Tiglath-pileser king of Assyria. He saw an altar in Damascus and sent to Uriah the priest a sketch of the altar, with detailed plans for its construction.

Mark 7:14 Again Jesus called the crowd to him and said, "Listen to me, everyone, and understand this. 15 Nothing outside a man can make him 'unclean' by going into him. Rather, it is what comes out of a man that makes him 'unclean.' " ... 17 After he had left the crowd and entered the house, his disciples asked him about this parable. 18 "Are you so dull?" he asked. "Don't you see that nothing that enters a man from the outside can make him 'unclean'? 19 For it doesn't go into his heart but into his stomach, and then out of his body." (In saying this, Jesus declared all foods "clean.") 20 He went on: "What comes out of a man is what makes him 'unclean.' 21 For from within, out of men's hearts, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, 22 greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance and folly. 23 All these evils come from inside and make a man 'unclean.'"

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
III. Can the Original Image Be Restored?


