A Case Study

An individual has an exciting business idea. After researching it thoroughly, the individual was convinced it would work, that he could do it, and that he was the one who should do it. But he needs some help: a partner, some venture capital, something like that.

So, he put together a proposal with all the information. He had it professionally printed and assembled, obtained a nice cover for the proposal, etc.

Two years have now passed. The person has shown the proposal to quite a few friends and relatives, who are all enthusiastic about it, but he's never shown it to anyone who could actually help him in a meaningful way. Over the course of that time, he has made slight variations to the proposal, but they were almost completely cosmetic. (For example, he changed colors in one of the graphs.) Answer each of the following:
